It all started -

The **Buick Electra** is a <u>full-size luxury car</u> manufactured and marketed by <u>Buick</u> from 1959 to 1990, over six generations. Introduced as the replacement for the <u>Roadmaster</u> lines, the Electra served as the flagship Buick sedan line through its entire production and was offered as a six-passenger four-door sedan with two-door sedan, two-door convertible, and five-door station wagon variants.

The Electra initially used GM's rear-drive <u>C Platform</u>, undergoing a significant downsizing for 1977.

For its sixth generation, introduced for model year 1985, the Electra underwent another significant downsizing, and adopted unibody construction as well as GM's new front-drive C Platform — becoming along with its rebadged variants, the Oldsmobile 98 and Cadillac Deville and Fleetwood, the company's first full-size, unibody, transverse engine, front-drive cars.

For 1991, Buick retired the Electra nameplate, migrating its front-drive premium sedan to the <u>Buick Park Avenue</u> nameplate, previously used as an upper trim level of the Electra itself. The Electra Estate was redesigned, becoming the <u>Roadmaster Estate</u> for 1991.

In late 2022, Buick announced plans to revive the *Electra* nameplate for its forthcoming 2024 electric models
